I was personally inspired by her dedication to serving others, perhaps most by her ongoing project of having calligraphers send beautifully lettered cards and envelopes with birthday wishes to San Francisco senior citizens, through Little Brothers Friends of the Elderly. We continue to enjoy a day of fun with the Trivial Pursuits program she created and nurtured, now in the able hands of Lily and Charles Stevenson. Of course, there are a host of other ways people got to know Anne and to experience her sense of joy and love of letters and her warmth and humor. An email request has been sent to members, and there is a notice in this Bulletin, asking friends of Anne to send memories, by email or snail mail, to Marcia Friedman (who will be our new Alphabet editor) for use in an upcoming article and to forward to Anne's husband and daughter.

I am a little tardy in getting this message to Editor David Brookes, and have begged his indulgence, but it gives me a chance to say that the Annual General Meeting was wonderful, with an interesting and well-illustrated lecture by Mel Ahlborn on C.G. Jung's *The Red Book*. I brought my copy (yes, I was so taken by it, I purchased the W.W. Norton facsimile copy) for people to

We had a large turnout, treats by Laura Bernabei and members who came, and celebrated 35 years of our organization (thank you, Jane Brenner, for the reminder) with a message assembled from individual letters scribed by Ward Dunham and Linnea Lundquist's Black Sabbath blackletter class, scanned and enlarged by Dean Robino with some help from the Editor, and a bit of advice from Georgianna in their festive placement on the wall. Also on the walls were a number of old AGM flyers, including the "First Meeting" flyer, scavenged from the San Francisco Public Library. I came upon these because I learned of a project that came about because Hobie MacQuarrie asked Susie Taylor if there was any way he could be of assistance. Shortly thereafter, he found himself organizing all the publications guilds have exchanged with us over the years (16 boxes and over 100 hours, by Hobie's count) and making an archive set for FOC of our publications and our flyers, calendars, directories, etc., mailed out over the years. It is quite an effort, still in progress, and we owe thanks to Hobie and Susie for making sure we will have this record of our history. Several people at the meeting received a special treat because Susie brought copies of historical Alphabets edited by John Prestianni and Carl Rohrs to distribute.

We had reports on membership and treasury (all is well), and we elected officers, directors and Alphabet editor for 2010-2011. I will stay on as president, as will the other officers— Vice President Laura Bernabei, Treasurer Teresa Doane and Secretary Jerry Lehman. Council members Jenn Enault, Georgianna Greenwood, Megan Lucas and Elizabeth Nisperos will also remain. We will be joined by new Council member Jessie Evans and Alphabet editor Marcia Friedman. It is a group I look forward to working with in the coming year. The members also voted on the dues increase and the measure passed unanimously. This will

Hand Bookbinders of California Exhibit

Hand Bookbinders of California is holding its 38th annual exhibition of members' work at the San Francisco Public Library in the 6th floor Skylight Gallery from June 8 until August 15. It will move to the Doyle Library on the campus of the Santa Rosa Junior College in Santa Rosa for September and October.

The exhibit will contain a case bound book by Lily Stevenson, an early [and beloved] FOC member. The book is bound with buttonhole stitch and includes her own methyl cellulose paste end papers.

Decorated Capitals with Judy Detrick

A gang of twenty lucky and eager participants gathered at Fort Mason very own Judy Detrick on Decorated Capitals. Actually twenty-one; workshop coordinator. I had a comb bound notebook the cover announcement on FOC's website, a cheery yellow folder to hold class papers, decorated from the same website (I need constant and upbeat inspiration), and a pitifully small bag of supplies: layout bond, micron pen, a few watercolors, a brush, a pencil, a rag, nothing I didn't already have. Judy supplied Hahnemühle Ingres paper and some powdered Armenian bole. But with those meager supplies we accomplished some wonderful things. Judy passed out a handout with color examples and we plunged into the fray. We started by sketching a capital in pencil on layout bond. When we were satisfied, we rubbed some of the Armenian bole on the back of the letter and traced it onto the Hahnemühle and then the fun began. No, coming up with an acceptable letter form is NOT fun, although necessary, I suppose. Judy uses Armenian bole to transfer the letters because it is easier to remove than graphite. She started with watercolor techniques, filling a letter with two or three harmonious colors and letting the borders touch. Then we painted in one color but dropped in a second color. Then we painted a letter with clear water and dropped in colors. Then we explored playing with the background: adding color to counter spaces, sponging a texture on the page before adding the letter, masking parts with low tack tape and then painting a background, putting borders around the letters and even integrating the letters with decorative leaves, flowers and patterns in a medieval way. We even flirted with simple gilding, applying gold foil to a smudge of glue stick or double-stick tape. Judy teaches a gilding class at the San Francisco Center for the Book that looks very, very tempting. Judy's calm approach convinced me believe that even I could do it, and I did. All in all, a most satisfactory workshop experience. db

FRIENDS OF CALLIGRAPHY COUNCIL MEETING, JANUARY 17, 2010

Sunday, 10:00 am at the home of Laura Bernabei, San Francisco

Council members present: Laura Bernabei, Suzanne Yoshii, Jerry Lehman, Teresa Doane, Jennifer Enault, Georgianna Greenwood, Meredith Klein, Elizabeth Nisperos. Megan Lucas excused.

Meeting called to order at 10:30. Georgianna moved to accept the Nov. 15, 2009 minutes as corrected. Jenn 2nd, all approved.

MEMBERSHIP: Currently there are 393 members. Jenn is completing a volunteer list.

TREASURER: Teresa reported current balances and income and expense. A thank you note has been sent to the Raymond Family Foundation for its donation. Teresa renewed the CD Nov. 23, 2009 for 9 months. The 1099 forms have been sent to the teachers.

The annual audit will take place Apr. 18 or 25. Two non-Council members will be asked from among the list of Susie Taylor, David Winkler, David Brookes, & Vicky Lee. Suzanne Yoshii will serve as the Council member.

WORKSHOPS: Megan sent a report that the Georgia Deaver workshop, Stylized Writing with Pen and Brush, Feb. 27-28, already has 11 sign-ups. Megan discussed a one day workshop on Modernizing a Manuscript Hand and a two-day on Fine Tuning Italic Writing with Sheila Waters for Apr. 9, 10 & 11. The Council thought these were good choices. They will be priced to ensure we cover Sheila's travel expense which will not be shared with any other guilds. The Friday workshop may be at Fort Mason. Sheila will be asked if she would like to give a lecture Thursday evening. Judy Detrick has agreed to do a one-day workshop May 8 on Decorated Capital Letters. Megan has emailed Janet Takahashi for September or October but has not yet heard back.

Trivial Pursuits was a great success. The event was full, with 40 students learning new hints from the 6 teachers. Lily & Charles Stevenson did a smooth organizational job, and gave each teacher a hand-designed folder. Laura donated a lovely lunch. Many thanks for a delightful day.

21 people have signed up for the Retreat, which will be held at Santa Sabina. Carla Tenret reported we need 25 to break even. Our insurance agent has been contacted for supplemental coverage for this event.

FT. MASON CLASSES: Elizabeth is overwhelmed with the attendance. Nini Smith's Envelope class was enjoyed by the students. Melissa Titone's class has 17 students with 6 on a waiting list. Claude Dieterich A.'s Handwriting class beginning in March has 11. In May-June Judy Detrick will teach Roman Caps, & already there are 4 students.

The Pacific Scribes guild contacted Elizabeth to learn more about how we run our successful Fort Mason classes and our pay scales. Georgianna sent them a reply, providing our form of contract & stating the importance of publicizing classes.

HOLIDAY PARTY: Georgianna again opened her home for this event. Jerry & Laura organized a silent auction of the books donated by Brenda Walton, which went very well, making over \$200.00. It was a lively day with Show & Tell, Alan Blackman presented another fun-filled quiz, and there was a delicious buffet.

PUBLICATIONS: Alphabet is at the printer and will be ready for mailing. David Brookes is working on the Bulletin. JoAnn Brand is organizing the mailing crew for the Feb. 4 mailing which will include Alphabet, Bulletin, April workshops flyer, AGM nominations forms & Directory up-date.

OLD BUSINESS: Suzanne has collected all important FOC documents that can be found, especially those from Susie Taylor along with the minutes from Jerry. She will find a central location for consolidating and storing these papers.

NEW BUSINESS: Judy Detrick will retire as Alphabet editor after June. She volunteered to help the next editor any way she can. She thought perhaps co-editors might work, and suggested that consider increasing the stipend paid to the next editor. Georgianna agreed to look into the going rates for editing publications. Several names were suggested as possible editors.

At the next meeting the Council will discuss raising the FOC membership dues from \$36 to \$40 a year to cover an increase in the stipend and our other rising costs.

Several names were mentioned for the speaker at the AGM program: Martin Jackson from Canada, suggested by Georgianna, was the first choice, so she will contact him to see if he would be available and, if so, will find out whether we could have travel funds donated.

Teresa moved to adjourn, Elizabeth 2nd, all approved.

FRIENDS OF CALLIGRAPHY COUNCIL MEETING, MARCH 21, 2010

Sunday, 10:00 AM at the home of Georgianna Greenwood, Berkeley

Council members present: Laura Bernabei, Suzanne Yoshii, Jerry Lehman, Teresa Doane, Georgianna Greenwood, Meredith Klein, Megan Lucas, Jennifer Enault, Elizabeth Nisperos.

The meeting was called to order at 10:20. Jenn moved to accept the January 17, 2010 minutes as corrected. Georgianna 2nd, all approved.

MEMBERSHIP: Jenn reported 400 current members (363 renewals, 28 new members, 9 honorary) and provided current volunteer lists.

TREASURY: Teresa presented the FOC current banking activity & balance. We are consistent with our budget. She will follow up on a question regarding Retreat income and expense. The annual audit will be April 18 with Susie Taylor, David Winkler and Suzanne Yoshii as auditors and treasurer Teresa Doane.

WORKSHOPS: Megan reported that the Georgia Deaver class was full. Sheila Waters' classes April 9-11 are both full, Judy Detrick's class on Decorated Capitals will be held May 8. Janet Takahashi will give a class in September. Megan is researching future classes and venues for year 2011: Liesbet Boudens from Bruges, Belgium (scheduled for August 6-7, 2011); other suggestions for two-day workshops include Barbara Close (Textured Letters), & Risa Gettler (Visigothic Versals), Susan Moore (Painterly Letters), & a one-day with Brenda Broadbent (Paper/Ink/Tool). Several other suggestions have been submitted, including some for longer workshops. Council discussed a meeting that would cover future workshops and classes, including the Fort Mason program, but no date was set.

Carla Tenret sent a report that the Spring Retreat was again a success; full with a waiting list; participants were well pleased with the event. This was

the first Retreat under new management at Santa Sabina. The 2011 Retreat will be the last one Carla will coordinate. The Judy Melvin summer workshop is scheduled for June 23-27, to be held at the International House at UC Berkeley. David Winkler will host Judy.

FT MASON CLASSES: Elizabeth reported that Melissa Titone's class on Copperplate had 17 students as did Claude Dieterich's handwriting class that began March 10. Judy Detrick will teach Roman Caps May 4 thru June 15, & already has 8 students. Georgianna will teach Basic Design in September. The Council congratulated Elizabeth for another successful year of Ft Mason Beginning classes.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING: The AGM will be held May 23. Mel Ahlborn will give a lecture & slide show on The Red Book by C. G. Jung. She will receive a stipend of \$200.00. Suggestions were made for the open spot on Council for 2010-2011. Meredith will follow up. Elizabeth will design the slate poster for the AGM; Jerry & Laura will handle hospitality. JoAnn B. Brand will be asked to write the names on certificates of acknowledgment to be presented to retiring Council member Suzanne Y., retiring Alphabet editor Judy D.; to Lily & Charles Stevenson for Trivial Pursuits, and, for Kalligraphia, to Susie Taylor, Pat Akre, David Winkler, and Georgianna. The Council discussed program for the 2011 AGM.

PUBLICATIONS and MAILINGS: The April mailing will include the Bulletin, flyers for AGM & summer workshop & directory update. Small envelopes were ordered to save on mailing costs. The May 8 Judy Detrick workshop flyer will be emailed, snail-mailed only to members without email.

OLD BUSINESS: In the past Susie Taylor has been storing older important documents for FOC, these were taken and reviewed by Suzanne Yoshii and will be stored by the current treasurer.

Judy Detrick will retire as Alphabet editor after the June issue. She volunteered to assist the next editor if needed. She recommended that the stipend be increased. Georgianna posed the question to a number of past Alphabet editors and other members who design publications for nonprofit groups, & she presented a summary of their responses. The stipend for the Alphabet editor has not been increased since it was adopted in 1982. Respondents were unanimous in recommending an increase. One person observed that the editor does work that used to be sent out to typesetters, in addition to determining the articles, editing, graphic design, proofreading and dealing with the printer. The Council agreed that the journal is a significant part of FOC membership, and it also represents our purpose in the greater community of scribes, guilds and institutions. Jerry moved that, considering the amount of editorial and design work necessary to produce our journal, we increase the stipend to \$7,500 a year for producing three issues of Alphabet. Megan 2nd, all approved.

The Council then discussed a dues increase. Our dues do not cover per-member costs, which currently come to about \$52 per person; the difference is made up by workshops and classes that fill, donations, and memberships at higher levels. In order to accommodate the increased stipend, as well as increasing costs of printing, mailing etc., Jenn moved to increase membership dues to \$40 for regular members, \$45 for married/domestic partners. Elizabeth 2nd, all approved. This motion will be presented to the members attending the AGM meeting for a vote of approval.

NEW BUSINESS: Jenn suggested that FOC establish an FOC Facebook page to promote FOC in the social media. Council members were interested and want to explore the idea further before taking action.

The New York Society of Scribes is presenting a free webcast concerning a Calligraphy Business Panel. FOC member Melissa Dinwiddie is on the panel. Laura moved that FOC email the membership as this may be of interest. Jenn 2nd, all approved. Judy Detrick will be asked to send an email to FOC members.

Megan moved that the meeting be adjourned, Teresa 2nd, all approved
